

Dear Visitor:

Please #RecreateResponsibly and KNOW BEFORE YOU GO!

Yosemite National Park will be requiring a reservation to drive into or through the park during peak hours (5am to 4pm) on some days from April 13 through October 27, 2024.

Reservations are required:

- April 13 thru June 30, Saturdays & Sundays and holidays (May 27 & June 19) only during peak hours (5am - 4pm)
- July 1 thru August 16, seven days a week during peak hours (5am - 4pm)
- August 17 thru October 27, Saturdays & Sundays and holidays (Sept 2 & Oct 14) only during peak hours (5am - 4pm)

WHEN you can get reservations:

- NOW Reservations are still available for many dates this season.
- If none are currently available, more will be released 7 days prior to arrival at 8am Pacific Time. Tip: Be signed in to your account at recreation.gov and ready to book at 8 am.

Tips for Visiting Yosemite:

- o Yosemite Valley shuttle buses are free and the best way to get around the valley. Routes and stop info, including any updates, are found on the park's website. www.nps.gov/yose/planyourvisit/publictransportation.htm
- o The Mariposa Grove of Giant Sequoias is located just inside the park's South Entrance. It's perfect for either an early morning, or a late day exploration if you don't have a Peak-Hours Pass. More info at www.nps.gov/yose/planyourvisit/mg.htm. Catching the sunset at Glacier Point or Sentinel Dome is another great thing to do during the summer months after peak hours.
- o Tuolumne Meadows Campground is closed for major rehabilitation until 2025. All other park campgrounds are planned to be open with reservations required April through October. There will be no first-come, first-served campgrounds. www.nps.gov/yose/planyourvisit/camping.htm



Yosemite In A Day or more

DAY 1 (Yosemite Valley)

Keep up to date on traffic and parking conditions within the park

Yosemite Traffic **Alerts** Text **YNPTRAFFIC** to **333111**

Glacier Point (Open Seasonally) Make your way up to Glacier Point via Glacier Point Road. At over 3000 feet above the valley floor, this grand vista offers a bird's-eye view of Yosemite Valley, many of the valley's majestic waterfalls, and the massive granite peaks of Yosemite's high country.

Tunnel View

This stunning and popular view is a "must see" stop on your visit. Made most famous by Ansel Adams, from here many of Yosemite's key landmarks can be seen: El Capitan, Bridalveil Fall, Half Dome, Clouds Rest, Sentinel Dome (and many more). Then continue your journey toward Yosemite Valley.

Bridalveil Fall and Swinging Bridge Just under 4 miles from the Bridalveil Fall parking area and trailhead (expected to re-open spring 2024) this popular picnic area, complete with picnic tables and grills, offers great views of the Merced River, Sentinel Rock and Yosemite Falls (both day and nighttime views can be stunning). The bridge no longer moves, the current structure replaced a swinging one that was damaged in a flood several decades ago, but the views will move you!

Yosemite Chapel

The Yosemite Chapel is the oldest building still in continuous use in Yosemite Valley. Dating back to 1879, the chapel offers both a history lesson and a spectacular view of Yosemite Falls. It's also a fantastic location to capture fall photos.

Yosemite Village, Valley Loop Trail & Yosemite Falls Follow the signs for Visitor Parking area. There is much to see in the Yosemite Village including the new Yosemite Valley Welcome Center, the Yosemite Exploration Center, the Yosemite Museum, Ansel Adams Gallery and the Indian Village, just to name a few. Looking for a bite to eat? Step into Degnan's Deli for a tasty sandwich. We suggest taking it to-go and enjoying a short walk to Lower Yosemite Fall. There, you can enjoy your meal while gazing at the magnificent 2,425 foot waterfall. From the lower fall, head out on the Valley Loop Trail and stroll your way through the valley enjoying views of Half Dome, El Capitan and the Merced River from many different angles. Along the way enjoy scenes of lush meadows, wildflowers and a possible deer or coyote sighting.

Valley View

Stopping at this picturesque location at the end of your day of exploring the valley provides a nice balance to your start at Tunnel View. Here the Merced River flows on by and the late day light paints the walls of the western end of the valley. The warm light highlights the towering granite walls and brings out unique color and details. You get a true appreciation for why this much photographed spot is also known as the Gates of the Valley.

PARK RESERVATION UPDATE

Yosemite has indicated that a pilot reservation system will be implemented for the Summer 2024 season. You can find out the latest information about any reservation system, as well as park projects & conditions, in our "What to Expect When Visiting Yosemite Now" article.



DAY 2 (Highway 41)

Mariposa Grove

Stand among some of the world's oldest and largest trees in the Mariposa Grove. This is the largest of the three groves in Yosemite and home to several hundred mature Giant Sequoias and miles of great trails to explore.

Wawona


Located about 10 minutes inside the south gate to Yosemite, step back in time in historic Wawona. Explore picturesque sites such as the Yosemite History Center, the Wawona Hotel, the Chinese Laundry Building and the Wawona Covered Bridge.

Chilnualna Falls

Take a less-traveled hike to enjoy some of the lower cascades of Chilnualna Falls or plan for a full day of hiking and complete the entire trail to the top of the falls. (8.4 miles /13.5 kilometers).

DAY 3 (Highway 120 East) always check park status and updates BEFORE you visit Yosemite!

Tuolumne Grove

Park at the grove trailhead and take a short 1¼ mile hike along Old Big Oak Flat Road through a shaded forest. Here you can find around two dozen mature Giant Sequoias. Plan for 1½ to 2 hours of hiking.

Olmsted Point

Enjoy amazing views that showcase how glaciers shaped this part of Yosemite as you look down Tenaya Canyon toward Yosemite Valley. Clouds Rest and a unique view of Half Dome are key features toward the south with Tenaya Lake viewed toward the northeast.

Tenava Lake

The views around the alpine lake are spectacular and it's a popular location to enjoy a picnic, do some kayaking, take a swim or do some fishing. You can also choose just to lay back, soak up the sunshine and enjoy the fresh air.

Tuolumne Meadows

Just 6½ miles from Tenaya Lake is one of the largest highelevation meadows in the Sierra. Stop by the Visitor Center, take a short hike to the Parsons Memorial Lodge or simply enjoy the changing light on the meadow, the Tuolumne River and the many unique geologic features of the area like Lembert Dome, Unicorn and Cathedral Peaks.

Other Favorite Stops to Consider


Hetch Hetchy

Hetch Hetchy Valley was dubbed by John Muir as a "wonderfully exact counterpoint" to Yosemite Valley. The now water-filled valley boasts fewer visitors, truly beautiful scenery, and one of the park's longest hiking seasons.

The Cascades Picnic Area

During the spring, torrents of water from melting snow thunder over granite walls to form The Cascades waterfall. The picnic area right off of El Portal Road is a great place to enjoy a meal all while enjoying the sights and sounds of rushing water from both The Cascades and the Merced River.

Southern Yosemite Hiking Traits

While the trails in Yosemite Valley are some of the most popular in the park, we encourage you to explore other areas of Yosemite that are less familiar but just as impressive. Travelers are expanding their interests and discovering the beauty of southern Yosemite and Wawona. Find new paths and become a more sustainable traveler along the way.

The Swinging Bridge (Wawona)

RATING: EASY

More of a walk than a serious hike, this 1 mile out-andback trail provides access to the namesake bridge that crosses the South Fork of the Merced River. Unlike the Swinging Bridge in Yosemite Valley, this bridge actually swings (the Yosemite Valley Swinging Bridge originally did swing until it was replaced due to flood damage in 1965). Water levels rush in springtime, but drop down significantly months later making for the perfect swimming hole in late summer. At the Wawona store, turn right on Forest drive, then stay left when the road forks. There are pit toilets near the dirt parking area.

Chilnualna Falls Trail

RATING: MODERATE TO CHALLENGING

This 8 mile (round trip) trail begins at the end of Chilnualna Falls Road. There are restrooms and bear boxes at the trailhead. On route to the top of the waterfall, you will climb over 2,000 ft of elevation. Access this trail in the late spring or early summer for the most impressive displays of water. Chilnualna Falls is ephemeral, meaning it does not flowall year round. By July, the conditions in the region are mostly dry. However, the jaw-dropping view from the top is impressive all year round.

Alder Creek Falls

RATING: MODERATE

With over 800 miles of trails IN Yosemite and many more in the surrounding area, you have more that enough to fill a lifetime of adventure!

From the Wawona Campground, drive 4.2 miles to the parking area near the sign for Mosquito Creek, located at a distinctive hairpin turn in the road. The trail begins on the east side of the road, across from the bear boxes. Use caution if crossing the road. Climb uphill and east. It is an 8 mile, out-and-back journey to reach an impressive view of this hidden waterfall. The trail features many wildflowers, including colorful Harlequin Lupin in late spring.

Wawona Meadow Loop Trail

RATING: EASY

This 3.5 mile loop trail traverses one of the largest meadows in Yosemite National Park. Although a nine-hole golf course occupies the northern part of the meadow, the stunning natural beauty shines bright. Green grass and wildflowers fill the senses in the spring and hikers delight in fall colors in late October and November. The trail is horse-friendly, dog-friendly and bike-friendly, too!

Mariposa Grove of Giant Sequoias

RATING: VARIOUS

There are numerous day hikes found in the Mariposa Grove region of Yosemite National Park and they cover the full range of short and easy to long and strenuous. Explore the Grizzly Giant Loop, Big Trees Loop, Guardians Loop or even an excursion to the grove's highest section, Wawona Point. Ask for a map of trails to explore in Wawona and the Mariposa Grove at the Oakhurst Visitor Center. Note that the free shuttle from the parking area to the Grove Access Area does not operate during winter months. Depending on conditions, exploring the grove by hiking, cross country skiing or snowshoeing is an option. Know before you go and make sure to check current conditions.

Sierra Foothills Hiking Trails

Find hidden gems in Madera County's gateway to Yosemite. The land captivates the imagination with stories of adventure, history and natural beauty.

Lewis Creek National Recreation Trail to Corlieu Falls and Red Rock Falls

RATING: MODERATE

Yosemite National Park is not the only place around to find some amazing waterfalls in the area. The Lewis Creek NRT place is special. It deserves protection and care. This 7.4 mile outand-back trail is heavily trafficked in the summertime and during holidays. To hike the entire length of the trail, park at the trailhead located on Cedar Valley Road and hike north toward Sugar Pine, following the route of the historic Madera Sugar Pine Lumber Co. flume.

Ahwahnee Hills Regional Park

RATING: EASY

This stunning property has a lot of history. It was once home to the Ahwahnee Tavern, a stagecoach luncheon stop for President Theodore Roosevelt, Susan B. Anthony, John D. Rockfeller and the Crown Prince of Belgium. Today, there are 7 miles of walking trails, 6 miles of horse trails, a seasonal creek, a springtime pond and a picturesque barn on the property. The park is open Wednesday - Sunday 8am - 7:30pm. Nearby, take a self-guided tour of a California Registered Historical Landmark, the Wassama Round House State Park.

Hensley Lake - Buck Ridge Trail

RATING: EASY-MODERATE

Hikers, mountain bikers, runners and horses are welcome on this 6.8 mile loop trail. The best time to visit is during the winter and spring, when raindrops and wildflowers grace the landscape for a few short months. Bring \$5 for parking. Picnic tables, restrooms and campsites are available at Hensley Lake. Visit after winter storms to watch the surprising contrast of rolling grassy hills against the distant, snow-capped Sierra Nevada.

Oakhurst River Parkway

RATING: EASY

The Oakhurst River Parkway is an easy, 3 mile out-and-back trail that begins at the Oakhurst Community Park and winds along the Fresno River. It passes Fresno Flats Historic Village and Park before it makes its way to Yosemite High School. You return back the way you came.

Oakhurst Community Park

RATING: MORE OF A WALK IN THE PARK THAN A HIKE

While this one's not a real hiking trail, you can walk around the park with views of the Fresno River on all sides of this island-like space. It's also a great place to let the little ones run and play, put on performances in the center gazebo, and get their wiggles out in the

playground area. There's also several live entertainment and family activities scheduled here throughout the year.

North Fork – Manzanita Lake

RATING: EASY

Just 0.7 miles up Road 222 from downtown North Fork, you can explore this easy 2.1 mile outand-back hike to Manzanita Lake. The largely paved trail is great for hiking and mountain biking and fishing at the lake is a favorite activity for many. Dogs are welcome, but must be on a leash. While in the area, make a pilgrimage to the "Exact Center of California."

A year-round vacation destination, Bass Lake was named one of the "West's Best Lakes" by Sunset Magazine and has been a popular tourist destination since the 1930s. The lake is renowned for excellent water activities, mountain bike trails, hiking, fishing, shopping and lakeside dining.

With summer water temps reaching 80 degrees, Bass Lake is the perfect place to splash around during the warmer months. Relax on a sandy beach with a book, have a family picnic at one of the many day-use areas, or enjoy an array of water sports from swimming, paddleboarding and kayaking to motor-boating.

Bring your toys and launch your own boat from one of two public boat launches, or rent a fully-equipped boat from any of the three full-service marinas. Want to learn a new skill? Ask about water-skiing or wakeboarding lessons. You can even start your day with a little more balance by joining a morning paddleboard yoga session at Miller's Landing Resort.

On-water activities are not the only thing Bass Lake is known for. With the Sierra National Forest's 1.3 million acres as a backyard, the lake is a great jumping off point for all sorts of adventures, both big and small. Hike or mountain bike on the many trails, or take an off-road adventure into the heart of the Sierra (check out the Sierra Vista Scenic Byway on page 22).



Keep Bass Lake Clean


Let's all do our part and Keep Bass Lake Clean!

Add to this the miles of shoreline that don't have these accommodations. So always be prepared to take out everything you bring in (while you're at it please pick up any other trash you see).

Bass Lake Hiking Traits

Bass Lake is a popular destination for summer vacationers; the weather is warm, the water is cool and the good times are limitless. Fans of Bass Lake return year after year to hit the beaches and have fun, but water sports are not the only activity for the adventurous. Discover three incredible hiking trails starting at the water's edge and climbing into the Sierra National Forest. Come prepared with the proper footwear, enough water and a safety-first mindset, then enjoy the views from the top!



Way of the Mono Trail

RATING: EASY

Stretch your legs on a path that people and animals have traveled for hundreds of years. This 1-mile loop trail has 150 feet of elevation gain and offers sweeping views of Bass Lake at the halfway point. Interpretive signage and grinding holes teach about the history of the land and the native people who lived here. On the map, find the trailhead parking area across the road from the Little Denver Church Day-Use Picnic Area. (Reminder: It is a good idea to bring \$10 for parking in the day-use areas).

Goat Mountain Lookout

RATING: STRENUOUS

Named for the creatures that grazed here in the pioneer days. Returning from the fire lookout at the top of Goat Mountain, you might feel like a billy goat, too. Although the trail is rated moderate on some channels, be prepared for 9.8 miles, out-and-back, with more than 1600 feet of elevation gain. If you are looking for a challenge on two feet, you've found it.

The Goat Mountain Trail is great for mountain biking too!

Willow Creek Trail to **Angel Falls and Devils Slide**

RATING: MODERATE TO STRENUOUS

On the north shore of Bass Lake, explore this moderate-to-strenuous 3.1 mile out-and-back hike carefully (starting from The Falls Beach trailhead adds another ~0.2 mile). When visiting a waterfall or fast-moving waters like Willow Creek, use EXTREME caution. The rocks are slippery (even when dry) and the water temperatures can be deadly cold, especially during spring and early summer months. Give these waters respect. If it looks slick, it probably is. So don't go there! Be aware that along the way, you may encounter poison oak, mosquitos and gnats (the latter especially in the fall).

Sierra Vista

Scenic By Way A Day Road Trip Exploring Madera County Hidden Gem

Nestled in the heart of California is a road trip adventure with nearly 100 miles of winding road through the Sierra National Forest complete with wooded forests, wildflower filled meadows, breathtaking panoramic vistas and unique rock formations. The Byway runs through a large portion of the 2020 Creek Fire area in which 380,000 acres of the forest were transformed by one of California's largest wildfires. You can see firsthand both the impacts of this elemental force and the early stages of the area's recovery. In many places the landscape has changed, the scenes altered, but Nature's raw beauty and resilience is on full display.

There are many sights to see along the Byway - here just a few that we recommend you take in:

Nelder Grove

Yosemite National Park isn't the only home for Giant Sequoias in the area. Tucked away just a bit south of the park is Nelder Grove, a 1,540-acre home in the Sierra National Forest to roughly seventy of these wonderful monarchs. With hiking trails, historic cabins and an interpretive center, Nelder is both a natural wonder and a unique window into the pioneer history of the area. Note - The US Forest Service is implementing a multi-year fuel reduction project in Nelder Grove which will mean it is closed to public access for potentially up to two years. Please call the USF Bass Lake Ranger District Office (559) 877-2218 before planning to visit the grove.

Mile High Curve / Mile High Vista

Enjoy the expansive view looking above the 123,000-acre Mammoth Pool Reservoir and over the many geologic formations and rugged mountain peaks of this dynamic landscape.

Beasore, Cold Springs and Jackass Meadows

Come in late spring or early summer to see these meadows bursting with the vibrant colors of mountain wildflowers!

Jones Store

This family-run business has a history going back many generations. Stop in for a burger and a slice of freshly baked pie with a heaping serving of ice cream on top. Be sure to bring cash (credit cards are not accepted) and arrive early as they serve what they have until it runs out... and run out they do.

Fresno Dome

Take the short hike to the top of Fresno Dome to enjoy beautiful panoramic views of the Sierra National Forest. It was from atop this granite dome that John Muir was able to find the Giant Sequoias of what is now known as Nelder Grove.





Former President Theodore Roosevelt was reportedly photographed here during his visit to Yosemite in 1903. This formation was not placed here by glaciers (or giants) but was formed instead by erosion right where it sits.

Pet Friendly ROAD TRIP

From sightseeing in Yosemite to hiking the many trails in the Sierra National Forest there are many opportunities to include your canine family members in adventures through Yosemite's Southern Gateway.

YOSEMITE

Many ask "Is Yosemite dog friendly?"

The answer is yes, but with some important rules. In general, dogs are allowed in developed, fully paved areas. They are allowed in most of the campsites except for walk-in ones, like Camp 4. They are not allowed typically on unpaved trails, in Yosemite's lodging or dining facilities, or on any of the shuttle buses. Dogs must always be attended and on leashes or restrained in something like a kennel. Here's some recommendations of places to experience with your pup in the park:

- Tunnel View one of the most famous views in the park. It's an excellent place for a canine-inspired selfie or a family portrait.
- Waterfalls the Lower Yosemite Falls trail will bring you to the viewing area at the base of the valley's largest waterfall landmark. (Note - Bridalveil Fall is another short, easy and dog friendly hike. It remains temporarily closed as work continues on the Bridalveil Fall Rehabilitation Project. It is expected to reopen Spring 2024.)
- Glacier Point a highly recommended destination for both people and their pets with stunning views of the park high above Yosemite Valley.
- Mirror Lake Trail a short, paved trail on the east end of Yosemite Valley that offers great close-up views of Half Dome, Washington Column and Mount Watkins. (Note - an unpaved trail continues but dogs and bikes cannot.)
- Cook's Meadow Loop Trail right in the heart of Yosemite Valley a walk along the Cook's Meadow Loop trail delivers amazing views of Yosemite Falls, Half Dome, Glacier Point and Sentinel Rock.
- The Wawona Meadow Loop Trail this 3.5-mile path loops around scenic and historic Wawona Meadow.





Best Places to fish in California?

For some, it's a trophy-sized catch. For others, it's somewhere that gives you a bit of tranquility from daily life. Regardless of the definition, we guarantee you will find it in the Yosemite | Madera County region.

The guides at Sierra Fly Fisher/ Yosemite Rivers Fly Shop in Oakhurst lead fly fishing excursions to the Sierra National Forest, as well as Yosemite, Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Parks.

Get hooked on a national treasure... In Yosemite National Park, there are 58 permanent streams with over 770 miles of crystal clear water. In these waters live a myriad of fish such as brown trout, golden trout, brook trout and the native rainbow trout. Practice catch and release on the valley portions of the Merced River, wade into the glacial waters of Tenaya Lake, or keep it "reel" in the high country meadows of the Tuolumne River.



Redinger Lake: At this hidden gem, find seclusion and solitude while you're casting your line. Fish any time of year on this 500-acre lake. It's an excellent addition to any road trip, especially when checking out the geographical center of California or the town of North Fork.

Kerckhoff Reservoir:

If seeking a day of adventure with a bit of seclusion, Kerckhoff is a good option. About a half-hour beyond Bass Lake, find year-round fishing featuring eastern brook trout, smallmouth bass and bluegill.

Mammoth Pool: Mammoth Pool Reservoir is situated at an elevation of 3,300 feet on the eastern side of the Sierra Vista Scenic Byway. The reservoir is closed to the public during the month of May and the first half of June to allow migrating deer to swim across the reservoir so as to spend the summer in the Sierra Nevada highlands. Fishing re-opens June 17 until the first snowfall.

Eastman Lake: This reservoir. on the Chowchilla River, surrounded by tall and rolling hills, is a scenic and restful setting. It draws fishing enthusiasts from all over the region with the trophy-sized bass that lurk in its waters.

Hensley Lake: Just south of the historic town of Raymond, explore twenty miles of shoreline hikes, mountain bike trails and hidden viewpoints. Camping, fishing and picnicking are open year-round. A winter trip to this low-elevation reservoir is a welcome escape from valley fog and mountain snow.

Bass Lake: Located south of Yosemite National Park, Bass Lake is the place to fish. The annual Bass Lake Fishing Derby kicks off the famous lake's busy summer season each year the first weekend of May. Bass Lake has boats, tackle, bait, rentals, restaurants and California sport fishing licenses available for anglers.







You can find all kinds of adventures in Yosemite's Southern Gateway and if you prefer yours to be of the athletic variety, we've got you covered! From wrangling bulls to racking up the miles, there are plenty of ways to satisfy your competitive drive.

For endurance athletes, the competitive year typically starts off at lower elevations in March with the Tesoro Viejo Spring Classic Half Marathon. In May things move up hill, literally, with the very popular Yosemite Half Marathon. This scenic course through the Sierra National Forest ends at the shores of beautiful Bass Lake. It is often part of a full weekend of adventure including epic hiking in Yosemite, exploring the Sierra Vista Scenic Byway as well as the

many trails and activities on or around Bass Lake.

The Bass Lake Yosemite Triathlon has been drawing multi-sport athletes to the foothills since the early 1980s. The event was resurrected in 2011 and celebrates its thirteenth year in 2024. It offers both Olympic and Sprint distance courses and team options too.

Rounding out the competitive running opportunities on the calendar is a longtime local fall favorite, the Smokey Bear Run/ Walk at Bass Lake. Races range from 1/8 mile for ages 2-4, up to 10k run so there's something for all ages and abilities.

BASS LAKE YOSEMITE TRIATHLON

For folks who prefer to pedal as opposed to run, there are two events to put on the schedule. The first is the fall classic cycling event, The Grizzly Century & Gravel Ride. The Griz offers a variety of routes on roads, both paved and gravel, in the heart of the Sierra Nevada . From a relatively easy 24 mile course that loops Bass Lake to the namesake Grizzly Century: a challenging 100 mile ride with over 10,000 feet of elevation gain, long on the roads of the Sierra Vista Scenic Byway. For those that truly prefer the roads less traveled, there's the Everyone Loves Raymond Gravel Rides. This relatively new event (the inaugural one was in 2018) takes place in February and offers some fun and challenging routes ranging from 30 to 90 miles though the foothills.

Bass Lake Fishing Derby Anglers also get to challenge each other for bragging rights for the "Big Ones" at the Bass Lake Fishing Derby each May. The weekend-long event brings folks from all over the area to come enjoy the beauty of the lake in mid-spring while attempting to catch their share of over \$50,000+ dollars of tagged, prize fish. Bass Lake is not the only place for fishermen to go reel-to-reel. Both Eastman and Millerton Lakes are active sites for regional competitions throughout each fishing season.

Fans are treated to a variety of events including Mutton Bustin', the Michael Steen Exceptional Kids Rodeo and the pageantry of Rodeo Royalty. All of this is topped off with the excitement of Pro Rodeo competitions. The rodeo is truly fun for the whole family.

Live theatre thrives in Yosemite's Southern Gateway at The Golden Chain Theatre (GCT) in Oakhurst. Founded in the late 1960's to put on historical melodramas of the late 1800s and early 1900s as a tourist attraction (W.H. Smith's "The Drunkard" was the first play performed by GCT). Since establishing a permanent home at the former Snowline Bowling Alley in 1972, GCT has grown and expanded its repertoire significantly over the years. Recent seasons have seen a wide variety of theatrical offerings on the GCT stage. Dramas like "Mousetrap", "Steel Magnolias" and "Silent Sky", comedies such as "Savannah Sipping Society" and "Much Ado About Nothing", as well as several musicals like "Oklahoma", "Peter Pan", "Mary Poppins" and "Shrek the Musical" have entertained locals and visitors alike. Rest assured, the Golden Chain Theatre hasn't forgotten its roots. Classic melodramas such as "A Woman in White" and "Here Come the Cows" can be seen every season on the GCT stage as well as original productions like "Little Orphan Angela" and "Someone Save My Baby, Ruth!". The Golden Chain Theatre's productions are not limited to just their stage... check out the Moonlight Melodrama train rides at the Yosemite Mountain Sugar Pine Railroad for a family fun way to spend an evening under the stars in the Sierra National Forest.




Winter in the mountains is truly a special time!

NORTH FORK RANCHERIA OF THE MONO INDIANS

The North Fork Mono are among the original inhabitants of the foothills of the San Joaquin Valley and Sierra Mountains. North Fork Mono society has traditionally consisted of two clans represented by the golden eagle and the coyote. The animals stand guard at the Sierra Mono Museum and Cultural Center over the many displays of traditional Mono life. The old way of life for the Mono is exhibited through fishing, hunting, acorn gathering, cooking, healing, basket making, games and ceremonies at the Sierra Mono Museum and Cultural Center.


PICAYUNE RANCHERIA OF THE CHUKCHANSI INDIANS

The Picayune Rancheria of the Chukchansi Indians is affiliated to Chukchansi Yokuts culture. Chukchansi Yokuts are indigenous to Central California where they have inhabited areas of the San Joaquin Valley and Sierra Nevada foothills for more than 12,000 years. Many Chukchansi still live in these foothills about 30 miles north of Fresno; the headquarters of the tribe, Picayune Rancheria, is located there today. Chukchansi is the language spoken regionally, in which anthropologists have classified an estimated 60 tribes together as Yokuts—meaning people. Hence, Chukchansi Yokuts. However, these tribes all have similar culture and customs but have had different dialects throughout history.

YOSEMITE INDIAN VILLAGE OF AHWAHNEE

This reconstructed village is located on the former site of the largest Indian village in Yosemite Valley. The bark houses, ceremonial roundhouse, sweathouse, pounding rocks, cabin, acorn granaries, and chief's house are representative of the structures found in a Sierra Nevada Miwok village of the late nineteenth century. Today the village is still actively used by members of the local American Indian community for ceremonies and special gatherings.

The word "Miwok" is also spelled "Miwuk" or "Me-Wuk." Translated as "people" or "Indian people," it is used to identify persons who are descended from any one of the several different Miwok groups in California.




